The investment objective of the portfolio is to provide long term capital growth, by providing investors with exposure to an international collective investment scheme portfolio comprising of a diversified mix of global exposure to various asset classes. The Global Flexible Growth Fund, the target portfolio, is aimed at investors who can tolerate higher risk, as explained only by volatility, as it invests offshore and may have a maximum of 100% exposure to equities. The portfolio may from time to time invest in listed and unlisted financial instruments, in order to achieve the portfolio's investment objective.



Characteristics

The fund invests in a global multi-asset flexible portfolio, aimed at outperforming the MSCI World over the long term. The portfolio may invest between 80% and 100% of the assets outside of South Africa, and may have a maximum equity exposure of up to 100% at all times and is suitable for investors who are prepared to accept a high level of volatility in seeking long term growth. Investors in this fund should be willing to accept a higher calculated risk. A feeder fund is a portfolio that invests in a single portfolio of a collective investment scheme, which levies its own charges, which could result in a higher fee structure for the feeder fund.

Risk Reward Profile: High

Typically, the lower the risk, the lower the potential return and the higher the risk, the higher the potential return. RISK DEFINITIONS

Market Risk

Equity markets are volatile and the price of equities fluctuate based on a number of factors such as changes in the economic climate, general movements in interest rates and the political and social environment which will also affect the value of the securities held in the unit trust, thereby affecting the overall value of the unit trust.

Currency Risk / Foreign Exchange Risk

Liquidity Risk
